However you enjoy the great outdoors, you're welcome to explore all your options, right here in Laois.




You're Welcome

to the **SLIEVE BLOOM** Mountains

Steeped in folklore as the home of fearless warrior Fionn MacCumhaill, 'the Slieve Blooms' is the jewel in our outdoors crown. Through a network of wonderful looped routes, walkers and hikers can marvel at **Glenbarrow Waterfall**, trek to the **Ridge of Capard**, and savour the spectacular natural beauty that surrounds.

For a modern-day adventure, look no further than our challenging mountain bike track at **Baunreagh**, near **Mountrath**. A less-demanding trail begins from the nearby village of Kinnitty and bike rental is on offer in the surrounding villages.

Whether walking or cycling, mountain guides armed with local knowledge can bring you on organised tours, helping you make the most of the mountains.





WALK and **CYCLE** our trails

With so many to choose from, the incredible **Leafy Loop** and **Dunmore looped walks** near the town of **Durrow** are highly recommended. For a more relaxed wander, **Abbeyleix Bog Walk** is a two-minute stroll from the town itself.

On two wheels, you can **cycle** the beautiful **Barrow Way** by hiring bikes in **Vicarstown** close to both the **Grand Canal** and **River Barrow**. And with several marked trails to be found throughout the county's road network, exploring Laois by bike has never been easier.



You're Welcome to go FISHING

Coarse fishing has thrived in Laois waterways for generations. Every year, the **River Barrow** produces more award-winning specimens than any other in Ireland. The **Nore** is best known for pike while the **Grand Canal** is home to a veritable bounty. Twelve lakes dot the county, all offering excellent angling days out.

For **game fishing**, shoals of salmon and hovers of trout also swim freely in the rivers Barrow and Nore, and can be caught at several spots throughout the county. In **Coolrain**, Laois Angling Centre's springfed lakes are stocked regularly, while the **Erkina** and **Goul** rivers are renowned for trouting at **Rathdowney**, **Durrow**, and **Cullohill**.

Understand the history of shooting, hunting, and fishing at the **Irish Fly Fishing and Shooting Museum** in Attanagh. It's the only one of its kind in Ireland, and tells the story of our love for country pursuits over the last 300 years.
